  - Housing programs through Allegheny Link, and more.



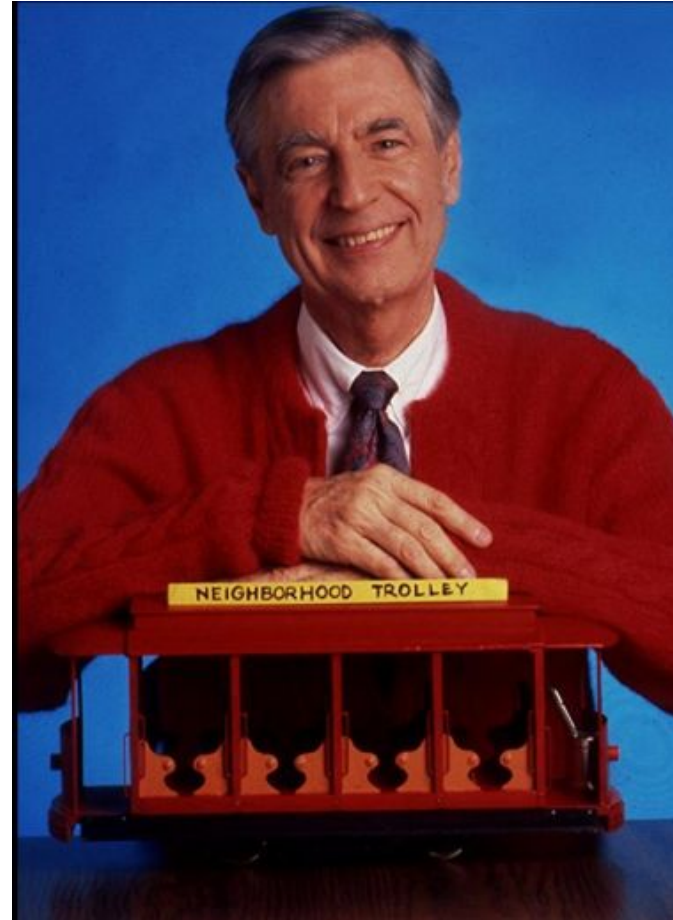

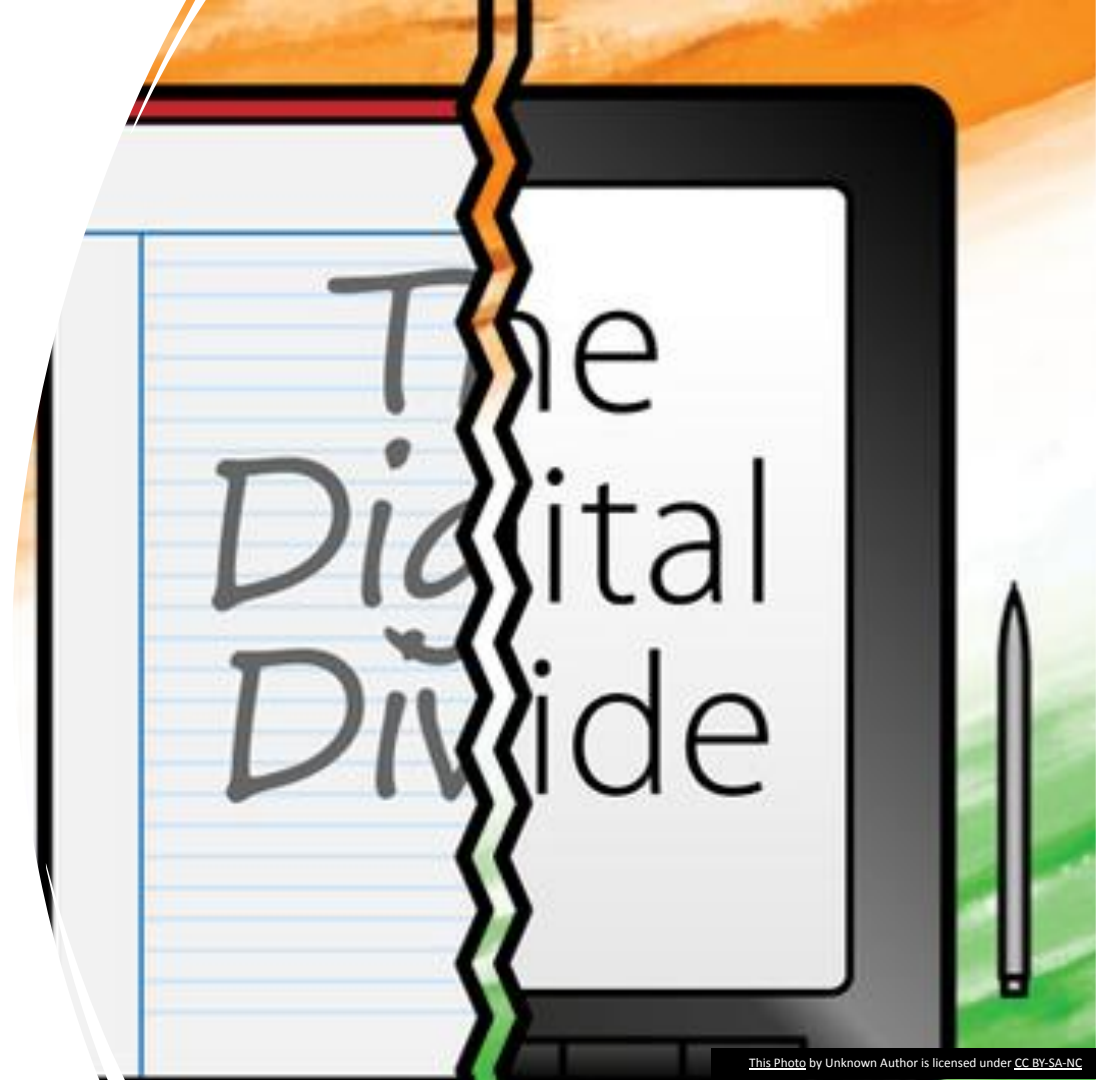

# Why Are We Talking About Internet Now?

---

- The Federal government is about to make a \$45 billion investment into improving the internet for everyone
- Pennsylvania is currently writing their plan for how they will spend more than \$1 billion in these efforts
- States are being given five years in order to accomplish their plans

# How much speed to you really need?

---

- You will often need less internet than you think
- For a family of 6, 200 megabits per second (Mbps) is sufficient
- Internet plans can always be upgraded at a later time if downloading content is taking a long time



# Which internet provider should I choose?

- Internet providers use different types of wires to provide service. Here's how the options stack up:
  - DSL – Uses telephone lines, low speed, low cost
  - Cable – Uses cable TV lines, medium speed, medium cost
  - Fiber-optic – Uses fiber wires, high speed, high cost
- Options will vary by location





# Affordable Connectivity Program

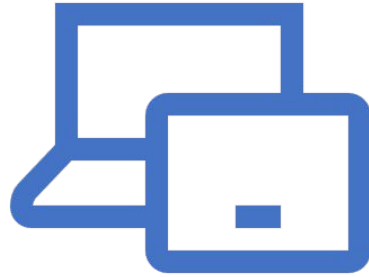
- With the FCC's Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP), you can save on your bill and may be able to get high-speed internet for free.
  - Service discount up to \$30/month
  - Device discount up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50)
- How can I qualify?
  - You, or your child or dependent are enrolled in government programs like Medicaid, SNAP, WIC, or others, or,
  - Based on your household income
- How do I apply?
  - Visit [www.affordableconnectivity.gov](http://www.affordableconnectivity.gov)

# Lifeline

---

- Lifeline is a federal program dedicated to making phone and internet service more affordable for low-income households. This benefit provides eligible consumers with a monthly discount of up to \$9.25.
- You can get Lifeline if you (or someone in your household) participate in one of these programs:
  - Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as Food Stamps
  - Medicaid
  - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
  - Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA)
  - Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit
- Some providers may include a low-cost or free smartphone with select plans

# Computer Hardware Terms

- **Central Processing Unit (CPU):** How fast the computer can read instructions
  - Intel Core
    - Higher the core, more powerful the device
  - AMD
    - Athlon - Low-end power
    - Ryzen - High-end power
- **Memory (RAM):** Space for the computer to temporarily remember information
  - Measured in Gigabytes (GB)
  - More memory allows more programs to run at the same time
- **Hard Drive (HDD)/Solid State Drive (SSD):** Storage space
  - Measured in Gigabytes (GB) or Terabytes (TB)
- **Monitor**
  - Measured diagonally
  - Options:
    - LCD -> lower quality, lower cost
    - LED -> Higher quality, higher cost

# Computer Reach

- Computer Reach gives free Desktop Computer Bundles to people in the Greater Pittsburgh Area through a weekly lottery system.
- All bundles are distributed at no cost to the recipient. Winners must be able to pick up their bundle from the Computer Reach Headquarters in Homewood.
